Message from Head Mrs. Richardson

On Wednesday, for the first time this term, the whole school was able to gather together outside the main building around the edge of the pond for our Remembrance service. This was therefore a moving occasion on many levels: to be together, to listen to the words of poets and historians, to reflect in silence for two minutes, to hear the sound of the next-door primary school children singing, and to be moved by listening to The Last Post. The scene was lovely and peaceful: the sun shone and a breeze caused autumnal leaves to fall gently from the trees over our heads. The Royal British Legion has drawn the comparison between the experience of the British people during the world wars and our experience during the pandemic – families separated, worry about what the future may hold and heightened levels of anxiety – and their message is clear: it is important that we treat each other with kindness.
