#### Weekly Literacy Tip: the importance of reading writing aloud

One of the best ways to improve your daughter or son's writing is to encourage them to read over their writing once they have finished it. They might be reluctant to so this, convinced they are finished and unable to spot their won errors. However, if they read their work aloud then it is more likely they will 'hear' rather than see their errors: missing words, awkward expressions or overlong sentences, for example. When they have completed a piece of writing,

encourage them to read their writing to you and listen together for any errors.
