Message from Head Mrs Richardson

'Education is not so much a state of certainty as a process of enquiry. And I think an educated person is not someone who can recite an army of facts and knows a lot of things; it is probably someone who has some flexibility of mind who is willing to examine their own prejudice, who has acquired a depth of understanding that allows them to see the world from another point of view. I suspect that education is less about knowing more than someone; but more about knowing someone - really knowing someone - who is not like you.'



These are the words of Tara Westover. Described as 'an American Memoirist', Tara Westover was brought up in a Mormon

fundamentalist family, received no formal schooling but managed to self-study and get into college, later doing a PhD at the University of Cambridge. Hers is an extraordinary story – and I recommend to you her book *Educated*, details of which are available on our *Curiosity, Creativity, and Competition* Teams and Facebook groups, the latter of which I encourage you to join. Dr Westover's thoughts on the value of education, what is true education, and the importance of trying to understand the position of others will, I know, resonate with Mount House parents, students and staff.


At Mount House we continue to place a spotlight on prejudice. On Monday, Mr McCormick and Reuben Ward (Year 8) will be giving the whole school assembly which will focus on the work of Maccabi UK and the Yellow Candle Project. The Yellow Candle Project is a practical and informal educational tool to remember Jewish Holocaust victims on Yom HaShoah and broaden understanding of the Holocaust. On the last day of term, all Mount House students will be given a yellow remembrance candle; with each candle comes a card with the name, age, date, and place of death of someone who perished in the Holocaust. We are encouraging all our students and staff to light their candles on the eve of Yom HaShoah on Wednesday 7th April, and then for parents and older students to share an image of that on social media, thereby creating a modern-day collective communal memorial. Mount House has been chosen as one of five schools in the UK to make a short video broadcast of students participating in the lighting of these candles that will be broadcast by Maccabi UK. These students were Oscar McAvoy, Ethan Roberts and Reuben Ward in Year 8 in addition to Alicia Ormrod, Savannah Durling and Roman McAvoy in Year 7. Well done to all involved.

Year 9 Biology – Mr Van Leevan

Year 9 students experienced a flavour of real anatomy this week with the dissection of a sheep's heart; there is only so much you can learn from 2D pictures in a textbook. The students made use of instruments such as scalpels and scissors to explore the workings of the heart. Most students started off slightly apprehensively on the surgical work but grew in confidence when the heart revealed its secrets. Perhaps we are looking at future cardiac surgeons in the making!





Enrichment through the HPQ

This term we have introduced the Higher Project Qualification (HPQ) for Year 9s proceeding into Year 10 in September. A number of students have decided to take advantage of this 2000-word research project, which is worth half a GCSE. They are busy at the moment with their individual supervisors deciding upon their area of study. One proposed area of study is to consider to what extent Mussolini contributed to the defeat of Nazi Germany. Another proposal concerns the debate over the death penalty.


Reminder: Sports course during the Easter holidays
