## Message from Head Mrs Richardson

It has been a glorious week to return to school, and although not always warm – yes, the heating is still on! – it has been wonderfully sunny.

The adaptation of some of the bubbles has allowed students in Years 7-10 and 12 to attend assemblies and clubs as mixed groups, with older students supporting and encouraging the younger years. This is a very welcome step towards normality. Year 11 and Upper Sixth students have undoubtedly felt less 'warm and sunny' than most, but are approaching their GCSE and A Level assessments with an impressive level of determination. The 'back-cover blurb' says this: 'first published in 1948, *Cry the Beloved Country* addresses the problem of race relations with the scrupulousness of the historian, the sensitivity of the poet, and stands as the single most important novel in twentieth-century South African literature'.



The weather for next week looks to be similar to this, although with slightly lower temperatures. For that reason, we will please maintain the current uniform expectations.





During PE lessons students practised striking and fielding activities with this week's focus being throwing and catching. Students had the opportunity to develop skills and perform these within competitive games.


It has been great to see students in Years 7 - 10 taking part in athletics and cricket this week during games afternoons.
