## Message from Mrs Richardson, Head

Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> January was a super busy day at Mount House, and we were delighted to welcome a host of visitors! At last, perhaps we are getting more back to 'normal'.

It was a real pleasure to meet some of our prospective new Year 9 and Lower 6<sup>th</sup> students, and also to have the Mount House Directors here for their monthly meeting. However, [sorry Directors!] the highlight of the day was certainly meeting Helen and Kate Richardson-Walsh. They came in for lunch with some of our students, popped next door to Monken Hadley primary school to speak to their students and then came back to Mount House to do a talk for students in years 7, 8 9 and 10. Helen and Kate spoke about their journeys – starting when they both played in their first



Olympics in Sydney in 2000, and before Mount House students were born! Their hockey playing careers ended in Rio in 2016 with a gold medal, and as a result of those 18-year international careers they had a wealth of experience to share. The highs and lows of playing international sport, of learning to win and lose and to do so in the right way, of resilience and perseverance and of self-belief were all messages that resonated with students and with staff. Of course, being able to hold and wear their Olympic bronze (London 2012) and gold (Rio 2016) medals was an incredible experience.



Helen and Kate then stayed on to launch the first session of our senior leadership programme. This is for Mount House sixth form students, current and prospective, and was focused on developing high performing teams, the first stage of which is that we all have to be able to articulate our own super strengths. There followed a team challenge involving dried spaghetti, sticky tape and marshmallows – and a lot of mess! As ever, we are very grateful to the Mount House site team who are so amazing at tidying up after us, and also thanks to the catering team for providing a great spread afterwards. We are looking forward to welcoming Helen and Kate back for future sessions which will support Mount House students in learning to lead.
