Message from Mrs Richardson – Head

It was a great pleasure to attend the Friends of Mount House planning meeting last week, although tinged with sadness as Keith Brueton has announced that he will be stepping down as Chair. Keith has been passionate in his belief in the value of the Friends in creating post-Covid opportunities for parents to get involved in School life. I would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank him for all the time he has given to meetings, quiz nights and bingo nights and for the unstinting support he has offered the School.



This week I have been reading about Anatol Rapoport. Born in Russia in 1911, in what is the present-day Ukraine,

Rapoport became an American citizen, trained as musician and worked in Vienna between 1929 and 1934. With the rise of Nazism in Europe, the Jewish Rapoport returned to the States and retrained as a mathematician, becoming a leading academic in the field of Game Theory: the branch of mathematics concerned with the analysis of strategies for dealing with competitive situations where there the outcome of a participant's choice of action depends critically on the actions of other participants. Put simply, Game Theory is the study of how and why people make decisions and has been applied to contexts in war, business, and biology. Rapaport himself held strong views on peace and wrote that 'the moral development of a civilisation is measured by the breadth of its sense of community'. He left the States in objection to the war in Vietnam, living in Canada where he died in 2007.

The Friends of Mount House committee exemplify all that is positive about community, and time spent in their company is always empowering – the sense of optimism and the drive and determination is always uplifting. This is something that we can all encourage in both ourselves as well as our young people, and as they approach the challenges of human relationships, we can encourage them to remember that by acting towards others with compassion and understanding, our community will develop and strengthen.

I very much hope that more parents will choose to get involved with the Friends – and I know that the committee are actively looking for class reps so now is a great time to volunteer! In addition, I would encourage you to support the Summer Fair, details of which are on the following page of this newsletter.

I hope that families are all able to have a pleasant half-term break, that the Royalists among you enjoy the Jubilee celebrations and the Republicans enjoy the additional bank holiday!
