# The passing of a national treasure – HM Queen Elizabeth II

When the death of the Queen was announced there struck a deep and solemn note in our lives which, as it resounded far and wide, and made countless millions pause and look around them. A new sense of values took, for the time being, possession of human minds, and mortal existence presented itself to so many at the same moment in its serenity and in its



sorrow, in its splendour and in its pain, in its fortitude and in its suffering.

The Queen was greatly loved by all her peoples. She was respected as a monarch far beyond the many realms over which she reigned for the simple dignity of her life and her sense of duty. We thought of her, so faithful in her study and discharge of State affairs; so strong in her devotion to the enduring honour of our country; so self-restrained in her judgments of people and affairs; so uplifted above the clash of party politics, yet so attentive to them; so wise and shrewd in judging between what mattered and what did not.

For seventy years Elizabeth II was Queen. Never at any moment in all the perplexities at home and abroad, in public or in private, did she fail in her duties. Well does she deserve the farewell salute of all her governments and peoples.

The following poem by the Poet Laureate, Simon Armitage, is a tribute, a 'floral tribute', to the life of Queen Elizabeth II.



Evening will come, however determined the late afternoon, Limes and oaks in their last green flush, pearled in September mist. I have conjured a lily to light these hours, a token of thanks,

A promise made and kept for life – that was your gift –

Because of which, here is a gift in return, glovewort to some,

Each shining bonnet guarded by stern lance-like leaves.

The country loaded its whole self into your slender hands,

Hands that can rest, now, relieved of a century's weight.

Evening has come. Rain on the black lochs and dark Munros.

Lily of the Valley, a namesake almost, a favourite flower
Interlaced with your famous bouquets, the restrained

Zeal and forceful grace of its lanterns, each inflorescence

A silent bell disguising a singular voice. A blurred new day

## **Exciting options now in our Sixth Form pathways.**

We are delighted to announce that Mount House School is expanding our Sixth Form offer to include the opportunity to take the International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme, as well as our current A Level offer.

A key pillar of a Mount House education is the individual approach we can offer students. The IB Career-related Programme (IBCP) allows us to build on this ethos with a pathway that gives some students a learning experience and qualification that is more relevant to their needs. The International Baccalaureate Organisation (IBO) is a gold standard in education, recognised across the world with over 5450 IB World Schools across 153 countries. The IB champions holistic education and critical thinking.

Mount House School is a Candidate School\* for the International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme. This school is pursuing authorization as an IB World School. These are schools that share a common philosophy—a commitment to high quality, challenging, international education that Mount House believes is important for our students.

The IBCP will give Mount House Sixth Formers an option that differs to A Levels in the approach to aspects of teaching and learning, whilst offering an excellent springboard for next steps be that Russell Group university entry, apprenticeships or the world of work. The Career-related Programme has four clear aims for students:



- To prepare for work in a knowledge society
- To prepare for the future
- To provide a locally relevant education
- To bridge the 'academic vs vocational' divide.

Having the IBCP alongside A Levels as a curriculum option for Mount House Sixth Formers means that we can offer a more personalized curriculum and a real choice of post-16 pathways. The IBCP offers some more flexibility in learning that is suitable for many students, whilst both A Levels and IBCP can offer a breadth and depth of study that Mount House students and those from elsewhere can thrive at in our Sixth Form.

Our **Sixth Form Pathways Evening on Thursday 6th October** is an excellent opportunity for Year 11 and parents to hear more about both the A Level offer and the IBCP offer in more depth. The evening will allow students to see how Sixth Form at Mount House develops attitudes, values and skills valued by universities and employers. It will begin the process of discussion about which is the right option for an individual student alongside considering the subject combinations that may be suitable for them. A letter to Year 11 parents is attached to detailing this further.

Students across the school have been singing Christmas songs in preparation for the Christmas service which will be held at the end of term. Students have enjoyed the atmosphere during choir and are looking forward to performing in front of and alongside the school in December.

#### **Drama**

During Drama Club this week we started the session with fun warm-up games which gave us the opportunity to work with students in different year groups. Following this we worked in small groups whilst taking part in improvised activities to create different characters and experiment with body language.

#### PE

This week students in Years 7 - 9 have completed our cross-country course. They have challenged themselves in different ways when completing the course and should be proud of their achievements.

Students in Years 7 & 8 took part in their chosen sport during Games on Tuesday. Our netball players were looking at applying a range of passes in matches and moving into space. During hockey students developed their dribbling and passing skills, with a focus on the push pass. Our footballers took part in shooting drills with special focus on early shots to avoid the defenders pressing.

Those who went to golf have further developed their knowledge of the sport and have applied their learning on the driving range and some on the chipping green this week. All in preparation for completing a three-hole course in the forthcoming weeks.

Those who took part in trampolining made progressions on their front-landings by adding in half twists before or after. We then looked at backlandings with and without support.





Students in Years 11 - 13 took part in the Moveathon and also had the opportunity to take part in a selection of golf, trampolining, table tennis and team sports. Everyone contributed to their chosen session and there was a positive vibe and energy amongst the three-year groups throughout the afternoon, which was great to be part of.

Netball club has been popular amongst students in Key Stage 3. We do welcome students who have yet to join us to further increase numbers and opportunities. This week students were familiarising themselves with receiving the ball from left and right and passing into space. They also had the opportunity to apply within a match.

Trampolining club has been extremely popular with Year 7, so we have allowed them to come across to different days to participate so everyone can get involved. KS4 trampolining club has also been popular having a nice range of girls and boys working together by giving coaching advice to help each other improve certain skills.
