


NEWSLETTER – 14th October

ART WORKSHOPS AND YEAR 8 CULTURAL IMMERSION DAY


















PE

This has been a great half term of sport, where students have had an input in selecting the sports they would like to take part in. We look forward to next half term's lessons and fixtures.






BAKING CLUB


